According to exit polls, Hollande has secured around 51 percent of the vote against some 49 percent garnered by Sarkozy in the run-off, which was held on Sunday, Press TV reported.

"I bear the full responsibility for this defeat," Sarkozy said after the result was made

Hollande's jubilant supporters have gathered in front of the Socialist Party's headquarters in Paris and come together in his hometown of Tulle in southwestern France as the news of the result spreads across the country just ahead of official announcement.

"French people, on the 6th of May, have chosen change,"



the victor told his advocates in Tulle.

About 46 million people were eligible to vote in the second round.

The run-off was held after Hollande inconclusively won the first round on April 22 with 28.63 percent of the ballots against Sarkozv's 27.18 percent.

He is the first Socialist politician to win the presidential election after 17 years of right-wing dominance over the country's politics. He now has to face the country's rising unemployment and stagnant economy, for which Sarkozy has been under fire.

Hollande has also criticized the austerity plans implemented by Sarkozy's government, saying austerity can no longer be the only option for Europe, and pledged to bring growth and prosperity back to the continent.

Iran makes arrests in connection with expert assassinations TEHRAN - Iran's Intel-

Iranian nuclear scientist

ligence Minister Heidar Moslehi says a number of terrorists involved in the assassination of Iranian nuclear scientists have been identified and arrested.

Moslehi told reporters on Sunday that Iran has recently made important arrests, and explained that those apprehended by the security forces have been arrested for drug and security charges, Mehr News Agency reported.

"Some of those drug kingpins recently identified and arrested have links to the targeted killing of Iranian nuclear scientists," the se-

nior Iranian official pointed out. He, however, declined to provide any further details on the case.

Mostafa Ahmadi Roshan was targeted on January 11, when an unknown motorcyclist attached a magnetic bomb to his car near a college building of Allameh Tabatabaei University in Tehran. He was immediately killed and his driver, who sustained injuries, died a few hours later in hospital.

Ahmadi Roshan was a Sharif University of Technology chemical engineering graduate and served as the deputy director of marketing at Natanz nuclear facility.

Darioush Rezaeinejad, Professor Majid Shahriari and Professor Masoud Ali-Mohammadi, other Iranian scientists, are also among the victims of such acts of On July 23, 2011, un-

identified gunmen killed Rezaeinejad outside his house in Tehran.

On November 29, 2010, Shahriari and Abbasi were targeted by terrorist attacks. Shahriari was killed immediately, but Dr. Abbasi, the current director of Iran's Atomic Energy Organization, sustained injuries.

Reds suffer another loss at IPL

TEHRAN - Persepolis has suffered a 4-3 home loss against Rah Ahan in the 32nd week of the Iranian Premier League (IPL) to stand only one step out of the relegation

The Reds tasted their 12th loss of the season in the penultimate week of league at Tehran's Azadi stadium on Sunday. The first half of the match ended 2-1 for the guests, as Bahador Abdi opened the scoring for Rah Ahan in the 19th minute, which was answered two minutes later by the Reds' Libyan striker Eamon Zayed,

but Abdi took the lead again just before the half time for Rah Ahan.

In the second half, Hossein Kazemi scored Rah Ahan's third of the day from the penalty spot in the 74th minute and only three minutes later Abdi completed a hat-trick to add to the Reds' misery.

Persepolis players then woke up to reduce the margin as Zayed scored two consolation goals for the Reds in the 82nd and 87th minutes,

which turned out ultimately in vain.
